• Proposal: make something like this an annually sponsored event of the student committee.

- Ideally: double student committee budget from \$10K/year to \$20K/year.
 - With extra \$10K, pay for travel costs of a few great instructors, production of notes available through the web.
 - With external funding (NSF, companies, etc): provide partial reimbursement for students to attend.
- Less ideally: use part of the surplus to fund this once fully, and see how it goes.
- Better than nothing: free and longer tutorials at ISIT.

- + Invaluable for students to have a chance to talk with others (peers/seniors) about their ongoing work, getting feedback that goes beyond what is available at home.
- + Helps promote our field and recruit new researchers. We are "the coolest society," or aren't we? :)
- + Highly successful tradition in Europe and South America (ttbomk).
 - Costs money. Are the resources available? Where is the money better spent, in doing this or in making sure Csiszar&Körner is available online?
 - The society "does not pay for conferences."
 - Need to make sure there is appropriate geographic balance, cannot be a purely north-american event.
